He resigned from the board to assume duties as the Auditor General.





1. Introduction

The Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board (SLAASMB) was established in 1997 under the Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Act No. 15 of 1995. Based on the definitions and criteria laid down by the Act, certain institutions are identified as Specified Business Enterprises (SBEs - see page 55 for definition of SBEs). These SBEs are required to comply with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards and the auditors of SBEs are required to comply with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards. The Act requires SBEs to submit their annual audited financial statements to SLAASMB to enable SLAASMB to monitor compliance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards and Sri Lanka Auditing Standards. SLAASMB carries out its function by reviewing financial statements received, reviewing audits of SBEs, conducting investigations on failure to comply with standards and taking appropriate corrective action with regard to noncompliances with standards by SBEs and auditors. Under the Act, Sri Lanka Accounting Standards and Sri Lanka Auditing Standards are prescribed or adopted by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka. In order to make recommendations and assist the Institute to adopt such standards, an Accounting Standards Committee and an Auditing Standards Committee have been established under the Act. The Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka adopts accounting standards based on International Accounting Standards (IAS) and International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) developed by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB). Similarly the auditing standards adopted are based on the International Auditing Standards developed by the International Auditing and Assurance Standards Board (IAASB). Presently the Institute has adopted nearly 40 Accounting Standards and 39 Auditing Standards to be complied by the SBEs and Auditors. A brief description of the main operations and activities of SLAASMB carried out to discharge its statutory functions during the year is given below.

2. Review of Financial Statements

2.1 Methodology followed on Reviews

The financial statement reviews are conducted to ensure compliance by SBEs with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards. The required action on non-compliances is determined based on materiality of the non-compliance. SLAASMB mainly focus on non-compliances relating to recognition and measurement issues. Based on the

findings, where a cause for concern relating to a significant non-compliance with standards is not observed, letters of comfort are issued to the respective SBEs. When the identified issue is material, but not significant to use statutory provisions, the issues are communicated to the respective SBEs in the form of a letter of assistance. When such deviations from standards substantially alter the financial position and financial performance, an undertaking is sought from such SBE to make the required corrections. However, where such deviation makes the financial statements misleading, legal action is instigated based on the statute.

2.1.1 Highlights of Review of Financial Statements

As at 31 December 2015, 1,410 SBEs had been identified for monitoring under the Act. During the year, 1,430 sets of financial statements from 1,345 SBEs were received and reviews of 1,122 sets of financial statements relating to 1,068 SBEs were completed when compared with 1,200 sets of financial statements relating to 1,151 SBEs during the previous year. The anticipated staff engaging in reviews not being available during the entire year 2015 resulted in SLAASMB being able to review 94 % of the planned number of financial statements.

The corrective action taken during the year 2015 revealed 50% SBEs as being compliant while 50% being compliant with issues. However, during the years 2013 and 2014, the number of SBEs which were compliant with issues was high due to the implementation of a number of new accounting standards which had become effective from 1 January 2012.

Significant deviations from the relevant requirements of Sri Lanka Accounting Standards which substantially altered the financial position and financial performance were identified in the financial statements of two specified business enterprises (SBEs). Undertakings obtained from companies in the private sector resulted in corrections to net profits/equity amounting to Rs. 0.55 billion. (see page 13 for Observations Made on Review of Financial Statements during 2015 and page 14 for Undertakings Obtained during the year 2015). The Undertakings are followed up for compliance in the subsequent annual financial statements.

2.2.2 Where an identified non-compliance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards was material, but not significant as to require the use of statutory provisions, such non-compliance was communicated in the form of a letter of assistance. During the year, 567 letters of assistance were issued to encourage those SBEs to improve their systems for financial reporting.

2.3 SLAASMB continued issuing letters of comfort to SBEs where a desk review of the financial statements shows no cause for major concern on non-compliance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards. In 2015, 553 such letters of comfort were issued compared with 498 letters of comfort issued during 2014.

3. Review of Audits

During the year, 91 audits carried out by 29 firms of practicing Chartered Accountants were reviewed, compared with the 100 audits carried out by 41 firms which were reviewed during the preceding year. Completion of 91% of the planned number was a result of the anticipated staff engaging in reviews not being available during the entire year 2015. Deficiencies were observed in 56 audits conducted by 29 firms. Significant concerns were communicated to the relevant audit firms (See pages 33-35 for Observations Made on Audit Reviews during 2015).

4. Investigations

Touchwood Investments PLC had made an application to the Court of Appeal during the year 2007 to quash the decisions of the Board that the valuation of the biological assets of the company in its financial statements for the years ended 31 March 2005 and 2006 were clearly unreliable and therefore to refer the said matter to the Attorney General. The application was allowed by the Court of Appeal in 2010. The Supreme Court granted special leave to the Board to appeal against the judgement of the Court of Appeal.

Based on a winding up petition filed by a creditor for failing to pay dues, Commercial High Courts of Colombo appointed a liquidator during 2014 for Touchwood Investments PLC. The entity is under liquidation at present. As the liquidator was in agreement with the appeal made by SLAASMB, the supreme court ordered to set a side the judgement of the court of appeal on 29 March 2016.

5. Performance on Recommendations of the Committee on Public Enterprises (COPE)

SLAASMB was examined by the Sub Committee III and the Main Committee of the COPE during the year 2012 in view of the importance of activities of the Board



towards monitoring of financial reporting of the SBEs. Inadequacy of the coverage of the number of reviews of financial statements of SBEs and considerable shortage of technical staff of the Board to do such reviews due to certain causes such as low salaries and inadequate funding were the major concerns raised by the COPE. In compliance with the COPE's recommendations, SLAASMB planned to complete review of financial statements of all SBEs (about 1,200) during one year period commencing from 1 July 2013 and to continue the same level of performance annually thereafter. For this purpose, SLAASMB introduced a new cadre and an incentive package to facilitate the recruitment of accounting professionals from the market and the General Treasury provided finance for the additional expenditure in this connection as recommended by the COPE. As a result, SLAASMB was able to expand its technical staff by recruiting 8 in the cadre during 2013. This arrangement enabled SLAASMB's performance to be aligned with the target as reflected in the Performance Information given in the Table in paragraph 2.1.2 above.

Since meeting the undertaking given to the COPE on reviewing financial statements of all SBEs during the past two years, SLAASMB considers moving towards a risk based selection of financial statements for reviews in the future as being a better means of enhancing the quality of findings on non-compliances. Accordingly, all regulated entities have been focussed to be reviewed annually while the other privately owned SBEs are to be reviewed on a systematic basis.

6. Assistance to the Standards Setter

6.1 In terms of the current arrangement with the Ministry of Finance, SLAASMB continued to provide an annual grant of Rs. 2.5 million to the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka to facilitate the work of the Accounting Standards Committee and the Auditing Standards Committee as adoption of high quality standards facilitate the proper discharge of the functions of SLAASMB.

- **6.2** The main activities carried out during the year in relation to revision of accounting and auditing standards were the following:
- a) Comparing existing Sri Lanka Accounting Standards against respective standards on the International

- Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) 2015 consolidated without early application edition. This publication was approved by the Council of the Institute in the year 2015 and is in the process of being gazetted.
- b) Six other Sri Lanka Accounting Standards are in the process of being gazetted.
- c) One Statement of Recommended Practice (SoRP) and Guidelines on Valuation is in the process of being gazetted.
- d) Approval of one other Guideline, a Statement of Alternative Treatment (SoAT) and an Interpretation (IFRIC) by the Council of the Institute for issue.
- Recommending amendments to nine standards were recommended to the Council during the year and one such amendment is in the process of being gazetted.
- f) Incorporating the International Auditing Standards issued by the International Auditing and Assurance Standards Board (IAASB) as per the International Federation of Accountant's (IFAC's) 2013 publication in the 2014 Bound Volume of Sri Lanka Auditing Standards and the Sri Lanka Standard on Quality Control 1 (Volume I) which is in the process of being gazetted.

7. International Relations

7.1 Membership in international organizations has enabled SLAASMB to keep itself abreast of developments around the world on matters relating to financial reporting, auditing and monitoring compliance with standards. It has also opened a window to obtain information and assistance from other regulators, and to carry out activities which are of benefit to many regulators as joint activities. During the year, SLAASMB continued its membership of the following international organisations:

- a) International Forum of Independent Audit Regulators (IFIAR) - SLAASMB has been a member of IFIAR since its first plenary meeting held in 2007.
- b) Consultative Advisory Group of the International Auditing and Assurance Standards Board (IAASB)
 - SLAASMB was appointed as a member of the Consultative Advisory Group of IAASB in 2007.



- c) Consultative Advisory Group of the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants (IESBA)
 -SLAASMB was admitted to the Consultative Advisory Group of IESBA in 2009.
- 7.2 The staff of SLAASMB represented Sri Lanka in the sessions of the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on International Standards of Accounting and Reporting (ISAR). The staff also participated in the international sessions which facilitated refreshing the principles of international accounting and auditing standards, awareness of latest standards, up-to-date developments in standards and the direction of the future developments. These sessions also provided practical guidance on application of principles by way of cases and interpretations and means of establishing international relations to foster knowledge sharing opportunities.

8. Human Resources

8.1 Staff

As at the end of 2015, SLAASMB had a staff of 20 of which 14 were Chartered Accountants. The total technical staff comprised of the 2 Deputy Director Generals, 6 Technical Managers and 6 Assistant Technical Managers. 5 of the technical staff were employed on a contractual basis while 9 were employed on a permanent basis. The increase in staff strength was facilitated by the implementation of the incentive pay scheme which was based on an approval received from the Ministry on the recommendation of the Salaries and Cadre Commission. The staff had international exposure on areas relating to financial reporting, auditing and regulation by attending conferences, workshops and training programmes on 6 occations during the year.

8.2 External Panel of Reviewers

In order to comply with the recommendations of the COPE, SLAASMB continued to engage reviewers to review financial statements received in its attempt to increase the number of financial statements being reviewed. 5 reviewers were engaged during the year. Of the financial statement reviews completed during the year, reviewers had completed the preliminary reviews of 72 sets of financial statements. The finalization of the reviews carried out by the external reviewers which includes obtaining additional information, seeking agreements for corrections and issuing observation letters are carried out by the existing technical staff.

9. Governance

- **9.1** In terms of the statute, the Board consists of 3 exofficio members and 10 members appointed by the Minister of Finance out of nominations received from identified institutions. The ex-officio members are Registrar General of Companies, Commissioner General of Inland Revenue and Director General of the Securities and Exchange Commission of Sri Lanka. The appointed members are nominees from the Central Bank of Sri Lanka, Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka (3 members), Sri Lanka Division of the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants of UK, Bar Association of Sri Lanka, Ceylon Chamber of Commerce, Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry of Sri Lanka, Sri Lanka Banks' Association and University Grants Commission. The term of office of a member is four years. Subsequent to the Presidential Elections held in January 2015, the members of the Baord were requested to resign and new members were appointed to the Board in May 2015.
- **9.2** Mr. P V L Nanadasiri, Director Legal and Compliance of the Central Bank of Sri Lanka, was appointed as Chairman during the year. As nomminations were not received from the Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry of Sri Lanka and University Grants Commission, 2 positions of the Board remained vacant as at the end of the year.
- **9.3** Messrs. A De Vas Gunasekara, S N Jayasinghe and N Sivapragasam members of the Board appointed in terms of the statute, served as directors or senior officers of some of the SBEs. Similarly, Messrs. A Herath, W W J C Perera, and L L S Wickramasinge, who were also members of the Board, served as partners of firms of practicing accountants which audit some of the SBEs. In order to ensure independence of the Board, all papers relating to matters concerning an SBE or its auditor are ommitted from the papers sent to members who have a connection with the relevant SBEs or its auditors. Such members do not participate in discussions on subjects relating to those SBEs.
- **9.4** The Board had 8 meetings during the year. The deleberations of the Board during the year covered performance of the staff in tems of overall operational indicators, action required to resolve significant technical issues related to entities under liquidation and litigation and significant amendments to relevant statutory provisons



in the Act to adopt suitable accounting and auditing standards for state organisations which do not fall within the category of SBEs to promote monitoring of state sector financial reporting under a common system. The Board also focussed on approving issue of letters of comfort to SBEs, issues relating to non-compliances with standards by SBEs, approving financial statements, annual budget and the corporate plan of the Board. Further, the Board was engaged in reviewing staff compensation to ensure the appropriate staffing to meet the set performance targets.

9.5 In terms of the delegation policy of the Board, regular operations relating to monitoring compliance with standards such as gathering information, reviewing financial statements and audits and investigations were carried out by the staff supervised and guided by the Director General.

10. Financial Performance

The operating expenses of SLAASMB for the year was Rs. 69,158,863 compared to Rs. 60,929,561 for the previous year. SLAASMB limited its operations to keep the expenses within the allocated budget. The increase in operating expenses was 13.5% for the year. Staff costs during the year was Rs. 37,322,152 compared to Rs. 32,438,665 during the previous year which indicates an increase of 14.7% for the year. Staff costs constituted to be 52% of the operating expenses of SLAASMB. Increase in expenses of the year was mainly attributable to the increase in staff costs due to indroduction of the interim allowance and increase of other staff benefits as per Government circulars and due to the depreciation of the motor vhehicles that were provided by the Government in December 2014. The expenses were financed out of funds provided by the Government. Alternatively, a cess can be levied from SBEs computed as a percentage of shareholders' equity or profit after tax which ever is higher as may be determied by the Hon. Minister of Finance under the Act to finance the expediture of the Board. However, this option was not preferred by the Ministry of Finance and the cess which was proposed to be in operation for periods commencing on or after 1 January 2008 was withdrawn by the Hon. Minister on 7 October 2008.



Observations Made on Review of Financial Statements during 2015

1. Undertakings obtained to make the required corrections

Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board (SLAASMB) obtained undertakings from two specified business enterprises (SBEs) to make corrections in financial statements. These undertakings resulted in corrections to net profits/equity amounting to Rs. 551 million.

Types of items for which the undertakings were obtained along with the Sri Lanka Accounting Standards (Prefixed SLFRS/ LKAS) not complied with by the SBEs are as follows.

- Failure to transfer the balance in the revaluation reserve directly to retained earnings at the time of disposal of an investment property which was previously classified as owner occupied property. (Reference; LKAS 40 paragraph 61 and LKAS 16 paragraph 41)
- Failure to prepare and present consolidated financial statements (Reference; LKAS 27 paragraphs 9 and 10)

2. Letters of Assistance

Departures from Sri Lanka Accounting Standards detected, which were material, but not significant as to require the use of procedure using statutory provisions, were informed to the enterprises, by letter, without extensive inquiries, so that enterprises could, where necessary, take corrective action on their own. Such letters not being directions issued by SLAASMB, are intended to be letters of assistance.

The main findings on which the Sri Lanka Accounting Standards (prefixed SLFRS/ LKAS) had been complied with by SBEs with issues observed are set out below.

 Failure to disclose information relating to the nature of the related party relationships as well as information about transactions with related parties - in 170 SBEs including 51 in SME sector. (Reference; LKAS 24 paragraphs 17 and 18; SME section 33 paragraph 33.9)

- Failure to disclose the nature and extent of risks arising from financial instruments to which the entity is exposed at the end of the reporting period - in 77 SBEs.
 - (Reference; SLFRS 7 paragraphs 31, 36 and 37)
- Failure to disclose the summary of significant accounting policies used when preparing financial statements including the measurement bases that are relevant to understanding the financial statements in 32 SBEs including 12 in SME sector.

 (Reference; LKAS 1 paragraph 117; SME section 8 paragraph 8.5)
- Failure to disclose the effective date of revaluation, method and significant assumptions used in the valuation and carrying value of property plant and equipment that would have been recognised under the cost model - in 35 SBEs.
 (Reference; LKAS 16 paragraph77)
- Failure to prepare and present consolidated financial statements - in 29 SBEs including 14 in SME sector. (Reference; LKAS 27 paragraphs 9 and 10; SME section 9 paragraphs 9.2 and 9.3)
- Failure to disclose an explanation of the relationship between tax expense (income) and accounting profitin 38 SBEs including 14 in SME sector. (Reference; LKAS 12 paragraph 81; SME section 29 paragraph 29.32)
- Failure to recognise deferred tax liabilities in 45 SBEs including 15 in SME sector.
 (Reference; LKAS 12 paragraphs 15, 20 and 24; SME section 29 paragraph 29.15)
- Failure to recognise impairment loss at the end of each reporting period when objective evidence exist, that a financial asset or group of financial assets is impaired.in 59 SBEs including 21 in SME sector. (Reference; LKAS 39 paragraphs 58, LKAS 36 paragraph 9 and SME section 11 paragraph 11.21)



Undertakings Obtained during the year 2015

1. Piramal Glass Ceylon PLC

Primal Glass Ceylon PLC had not transferred the revaluation surplus of the land which was subsequently classified as Investment Property and disposed during the year, directly to the retained earnings, and had transferred to the profit and loss for the year ended 31 March 2014. The auditors had not qualified their opinion on this issue. Subsequent to the inquiries made by SLAASMB, the entity undertook to restate the comparative information by reflecting the correct disposal gain and transferring the revaluation surplus directly to the retained earnings in the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2015. This resulted in a decrease in the profits for the year ended 31 March 2014 by Rs. 551 million.

2. Mackwoods (Private) Ltd

Mackwoods (Private) Ltd had not presented consolidated financial statements by consolidating the results of its 11 subsidiaries, in the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2012. The auditors had not qualified their opinion on this issue.

Subsequent to the inquiries made by SLAASMB, the entity undertook to present consolidated financial statements from the year ended 31 March 2016.



Letters of Comfort are issued to Specified Business Enterprises when Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board (SLAASMB) has not observed a cause for concern relating to a significant non-compliance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards after having performed a desk review of their financial statements. A desk review is a review of the financial statements with a view to detect a significant noncompliance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards which can be detected by a review which does not involve obtaining information or explanations from the Company, except in limited circumstances. A desk review could reveal some types of significant noncompliance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards and therefore is one of the tools used for monitoring compliance. However, it may not reveal other types of significant noncompliance and therefore does not provide an assurance that the financial statements show a true and fair view. Some specified business enterprises for which letters of Comfort were issued included specific items in the financial statements the review of which were not within the scope of the desk review.

Observations Made on Audit Reviews during 2015

1. Introduction

Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board (SLAASMB) reviewed 91 audits carried out by 29 firms during the year 2015 compared with 100 audits carried out by 41 firms during the previous year. Audits reviewed included 57 audits carried out by 4 firms which are members of international networks and 17 audits carried out by 17 firms which have conducted audits of less than 10 Specified Business Enterprises (SBEs).

2. Main findings

Deficiencies were identified in 56 audits conducted by 29 firms. The departures from Sri Lanka Auditing Standards detected were communicated to the respective firms in the form of letters of assistance. The main findings are as follows.

2.1 Failure to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence

Documentation relating to 28 audits did not provide a record of obtaining sufficient appropriate audit evidence from substantive procedures and from tests of controls to support financial statement assertions.

Deficiencies included:

- Absence of evidence of performing any audit procedures on any of the financial statements balances.
- Failure to perform any audit procedures to test the financial statement assertions relating to revenue, cost of sales, depreciation, property, plant and equipment, goodwill, investments, inventories, related party outstanding balances, loans receivable, payables, capital reserves, contribution against equity capital, retirement benefit liability, deferred tax liabilities, interest income and interest expenses.
- Failure to perform any audit procedures to test certain financial statement assertions.

Examples:

- Not performing audit procedures to ensure accuracy of reversal of capital work-in-progress.
- Not performing audit procedures to ensure whether the assets capitalized from capital work-in-progress met the criteria of capital assets.
- Not performing audit procedures to ensure accuracy and completeness of insurance provision for life fund and completeness of gross insurance premium income.
- Not performing audit procedures to ensure existence and ownership of investment property.
- Not performing any audit procedures to ascertain the existence of impairment indicators relating to investments.
- Not performing alternate audit procedures to ensure the accuracy of valuation of trade debtors when the initially planned audit procedures had not been satisfactory.
- Not performing audit procedures to verify existence and ownership of lands.
- Failure to verify the accuracy, valuation and completeness of cash and bank balances and loans and receivables of a finance company when a significant amount of cheques in respect of installment settlements had been returned.
- Failure to ascertain the percentage holding of investments to establish parent-subsidiary relationship.
- Failure to ascertain accuracy of income tax expenses and deferred tax provision.
- Not performing any audit procedures to cover the period subsequent to the interim period for which audit procedures had been performed in relation to inventories, revenue and cost of sales.



Observations Made on Audit Reviews during 2015

2.2 Items not sufficiently documented

Documentation in relation to 27 audits had deficiencies relating to matters which are of importance to support the audit opinion and to provide evidence that the audits were conducted in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards.

Deficiencies observed included failure to document the following as required by Sri Lanka Auditing Standards.

- Planning of the audit, audit program including nature, timing and extent of audit procedures performed and results of such procedures.
- The auditor's understanding of the industry, economic and legal environment in which the entity operates and the accounting and internal control systems.
- Analyses of transactions, balances, significant ratios and trends.
- Identified and assessed risks of material misstatements at the financial statement and assertion level.
- Evidence that the work performed by assistants was supervised and reviewed.
- Conclusions reached by the auditor concerning significant aspects of the audit, including how exceptions and unusual matters were resolved and treated.
- Representations received from the management.

2.3. Non availability of evidence of understanding and assessment of control risk

Evidence regarding the auditor's understanding of the entity's accounting and internal control system and of the assessment of control risk was not available in 20 audits.

2.4. Failure to establish the audit materiality level

Any records on establishing the materiality level for the purpose of determining the nature, timing and extent of audit procedures and on evaluation of the effect of misstatements were not available in 19 audits.

2.5. Failure to identify material misstatements in financial statements due to inadequate use of assertions to form a basis for audit procedures

Failure to identify the following material misstatements in financial statements due to inadequate use of assertions for

classes of transactions, account balances and presentation and disclosures in sufficient detail to form a basis for the assessment of risks of material misstatements and the design and performance of further audit procedures, were observed in 22 audits.

- Recognizing and presenting amounts attributable to unit holders' funds as a financial liability and distribution to unit holders as finance cost.
- Recognizing fair value movements of investments within equity.
- Recognizing and presenting revaluation reserve relating to the period prior to the acquisition of a subsidiary as a post-acquisition revaluation reserve.
- Recognizing and presenting loans granted by directors as equity.
- Not adopting proportionate consolidation method or equity method when accounting for jointly controlled entities.
- Measuring property, plant and equipment at revalued amounts when SLFRS for SMEs had been applied by SBEs.
- Failure to perform an impairment test relating to investments and trade and other receivables when impairment indicators exist.
- Failure to account investment in an associate company using equity method of accounting.
- Failure to present consolidated financial statements when subsidiaries exist.
- Failure to disclose significant events occurred after the reporting period.
- Not making provisions for retirement benefit obligations.
- Not accounting for deferred taxation.
- Depreciating freehold land.
- Not making allowances for impairment of financial assets
- Failure to classify preference shares as equity/ liabilities based on terms and conditions.



Observations Made on Audit Reviews during 2015

2.6. Absence of evidence on the basis of selecting the samples

Any evidence of the basis of selecting the samples for testing to gather sufficient appropriate audit evidence to meet the objectives of the audit procedures were not available in 20 audits while 13 audits failed to evaluate the sample results to determine whether the use of sampling has provided a reasonable basis when arriving at conclusions about the population.

2.7. Not ascertaining information regarding related party transactions

Evidence of the auditor reviewing information provided by the management on related party relationships and transactions, performing audit procedures to identify and disclose related party relationships and transactions and on being alert of other material related party transactions to ascertain the completeness of the information were not available in 12 audits.

2.8. Absence of evidence on the application of analytical procedures

Any evidence of performing analytical procedures as risk assessment procedures at the planning stage to obtain an understanding of the entity and its environment were not available in 10 audits.

2.9. Non availability of audit plans

Any evidence relating to planning the audit and on establishing the overall audit strategy were not available in 13 audit files.

3. General

Audit documentation of certain audit files reviewed did not provide adequate evidence relating to the implementation of quality control policies and procedures by audit firms designed to ensure that the individual audits are conducted in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards.

Most of the audits revealed absence of documentation on evaluating expert's work when an expert's assistance had been obtained by the management in making significant accounting estimates.

Not modifying the audit opinion relating to material misstatements, qualifying the opinion when there is no basis for qualification, improper wording in the opinion paragraphs, not documenting basis for the qualifications of audit opinion, not evaluating the appropriateness of the going concern assumption, qualifying the audit opinion referring to SLFRSs when the company adopts SLFRS for SMEs and referring to SLFRS for SMEs in the scope paragraph to the audit report instead of SLAuSs, were some of the salient findings in the conduct of the audit reviews.

Report of the Auditor General on the Financial Statements of the Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board for the year ended 31 December 2015 in terms of Section 14(2) (c) of the Finance Act, No. 38 of 1971

The audit of financial statements of the Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board for the year ended 31 December 2015 was carried out under my direction in pursuance of provisions in Article 154(1) of the Constitution of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka read in conjunction with Section 13(1) of the Finance Act, No.38 of 1971 and Section 33(2) of the Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Act, No. 15 of 1995. My comments and observations which I consider should be published with the Annual Report of the Board in terms of Section 14(2)(c) of the Finance Act appear in this report. A detailed report in terms of Section 13(7)(a) of the Finance Act was issued to the Chairman of the Board on 03 June 2016.

1.2 Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards and for such internal control as the management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatements, whether due to fraud or error.



1.3 Auditor's Responsibility

My responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on my audit. I conducted my audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards consistent with International Auditing Standards of Supreme Audit Institutions (ISSAI 1000 – 1810). Those Standards require that I comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Board's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Board's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. Sub-sections (3) and (4) of Section 13 of the Finance Act, No.38 of 1971 give discretionary powers to the Auditor General to determine the scope and extent of the audit.

I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my audit opinion.

2. Financial Statements

2.1 Opinion

In my opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board as at 31st December 2015 and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.



2.2 Comments on Financial Statements

2.2.1 Non -compliance with Laws, Rules, Regulations and Management Decisions

The following instances of non-compliance with laws, rules, regulations and management decisions were observed.

Reference to Laws, Rules and Regulations

Non-compliance

(a) Section 25 and 27 of the Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Act, No.15 of 1995

Copies of the annual accounts of specified business enterprises should have been submitted to the Board in terms of Section 25(1) of the Act and as persons who fail to comply with or contravene provisions, shall be guilty of an offence under the Act, relevant steps should be taken in terms of Section 27(1) (a) and (c). Action had not been taken in respect of non-rendition of reports on accounts to the Board by 17 specified business enterprises relating to the financial year 2014 even by 30 June 2016.

(b) Section 9.14 of the Public Enterprises Circular No. PED/12 of 02 June 2003 Even though the Board should prepare a Manual of Procedures providing rules and regulations relating to Management of Human Resources and thereafter obtain the approval of the Secretary to the Treasury thereto, the preparation of that Manual had not been completed even by 30 June 2016, the date of audit.

3. Financial Review

3.1 Financial Performance

According to the financial statements presented, the Government grants, which are the main income of the Board, had increased by Rs. 8,229,302 or 13 per cent as compared



with the preceding year and the recurrent expenditure incurred therefrom had equally increased as well. Grants utilized for capital expenditure had increased by Rs. 790,812 as compared with the preceding year.

4. Operating Review

4.1 Performance

The main objective of the Board shall be to monitor the compliance with Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards, by specified business enterprises in terms of Section 23 of the Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Act, No.15 of 1995.

According to the progress reports furnished to audit, particulars on the review of the financial statements during the 5 preceding years are as follows.

The following observations are made.

(a) Even though the progress reviewed in the year 2011 out of the financial statements received for review to the Board had been 12 per cent, thereafter that progress had regularly improved annually. However, out of the financial statements received during the year 2014, 87 per cent had been reviewed, but it had decreased up to 78 per cent in the year 2015. Even though the number of financial statements submitted for review annually had improved, a considerable number had not been reviewed every year. Moreover, attention had not been paid in respect of a proper methodology to follow thereon in future.



- (b) According to the particulars presented to audit, the external reviewers carry out a preliminary review and internal reviewers carry out an extensive and final review on accounting reports. Accordingly, the total cost (staff wages and incentives and payments made for external reviewers) and the unit cost incurred directly in respect of those reviews in the year 2015 had increased by Rs. 4,474 as compared with the year 2014. It represented 20 per cent.
- (c) Even though it was expected to obtain observations within 14 days after submitting the report to reviewers, rendition of observations in 12 instances had been made with a delay of a period from 17 to 86 days. The relevant institutions had not made any response whatsoever for observations submitted in respect of 13 out of 17 files examined. The Board had informed the audit thereon that the observations submitted are not statutory guidance and are submitted for the preparation and improvement of submission of financial statements in future.

5. Accountability and Good Governance

5.1 Unresolved Audit Paragraphs

The Board had been directed at the Committee on Public Enterprises held on 19 September 2012 to implement Public Awareness Programmes and the relevant programmes had been included in the Corporate Plan for the years 2015- 2019. However, action in this regard had not been taken up to now.

5.2 Effectiveness of the Management Information System

Even though the main function of the Board is the review of the financial statements, the Board had failed to operate and maintain a proper computerized data base system including the functions such as receipt of financial statements, forward for review, rendition of reports/observations and rectifications thereon and matters such as

selection of reviewers, relevant payments and incentives.



5.3 Internal Audit

Even though half yearly reports for the year 2015 should be presented according to the concurrence with the internal auditors, the internal auditor had not presented the final half yearly reports even by 30 June 2016.

5.4 Human Resource Management

The following observations are made.

- (a) According to Letter No. DMS/E1/4/6/11 of 21 April 2011 of the Director General of the Department of Management Services, 20 permanent posts of the Board had been approved. Officers had been recruited on contract basis with the approval of the Board of Directors to 05 posts belonging to the Top Management including the Deputy Director General of the Board without obtaining the approval of the Department of Management Services.
- (b) Even though the scheme of recruitment for the entire staff of the Board should be prepared and get it approved in terms of the above Letter, the schemes of recruitment for 04 posts had not been approved even up to 31 March 2015, the date of audit.

5.5 Budgetary Control

Significant variances ranging from 22 per cent to 100 per cent were observed between the budgeted and actual income and expenditure, thus indicating that the budget had not been made use of as an effective instrument of management control.

1. Corporate Information

The financial statements of Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board for the year ended 31 December 2015 were authorised for issue by a resolution of the Members of the Board on 23 February 2016. Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Monitoring Board is a Statutory Board established by Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Act No.15 of 1995.

The function of the Board is to monitor compliance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards and Sri Lanka Auditing Standards in the preparation, presentation and audit of financial statements of specified business enterprises under the provisions of Sri Lanka Accounting and Auditing Standards Act No.15 of 1995. The Board employed 15 employees on permanent basis 5 employees on contract basis as at 31 December 2015 (13 on permanent basis and 6 on contract basis as at 31 December 2014).

2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements of the Board are prepared under the historical cost convention in conformity with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards for Accrual Basis of Accounting.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis and the accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the period.

Events after the date of the Statement of Financial Position

All material events after the date of the Statement of Financial Position are considered and appropriate adjustments or disclosure made in the financial statements, where necessary.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is charged to the Statement of Financial Performance, on a straightline basis, over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows.

Depreciation is provided in the year of purchase and in the year of sale based on the period used, with full depreciation being provided in the month of purchase and no depreciation being provided in the month of sale.

Items other than books and publications purchased at a cost not exceeding Rs.7500/-, all Accounting Standards and Auditing Standards, and other publications with a cost not exceeding Rs.1000/- are expensed in the year of purchase.

Inventories

Inventories are valued at lower of cost and net realisable value. The cost of the inventories is arrived at by using the first-in, first-out (FIFO) basis.

Accounts Receivable

Accounts Receivable are stated at the amounts estimated to be realised, and where necessary, allowance is made in the financial statements, for bad and doubtful debts.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash on hand and in banks and short-term deposits are carried at cost.

For the purpose of the Cash Flow Statement, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand and deposits in banks, net of outstanding bank overdrafts.

Accounts Payable

Liabilities for Accounts Payable are carried at the amount of cash and cash equivalents expected to be paid.



2. Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Defined Benefit Costs

The defined benefit obligation for retiring gratuities payable under the Payment of Gratuity Act No.12 of 1983 recognised in the Statement of Financial Position, represent the present value of the defined benefit obligation. All actuarial gains and losses are recognised immediately in the Statement of Financial Performance and Other Comprehensive Income.

Government Grants

Grants received from the General Treasury of the Government of Sri Lanka are recognised as income in the period in which the related costs are recognized.

Government grants utilized to acquire assets that will be expensed in subsequent periods are recognized as deferred income. Government Grants represented by other assets including cash and cash equivalents, less liabilities (other than liabilities on account of the Grants received) are recognized as liabilities.

- Other Companies -
 - (a) which have an annual turnover in excess of Rupees 500 Million;
 - (b) which at the end of the previous financial year, had shareholders' equity in excess of Rupees 100 Million;
 - (c) which at the end of the previous financial year, had gross assets in excess of Rupees 300 Million;
 - (d) which at the end of the previous year, had liabilities to banks and other financial institutions in excess of Rupees 100 Million;
 - (e) which have a staff in excess of 1,000 employees.
- Public Corporations engaged in the sale of goods or the provision of services.
- A group of companies, anyone of which falls within any of the above categories. For this purpose, 'a group of
 companies' means a holding company and its subsidiaries, the accounts of which have to be consolidated under the
 Companies Act.
